Considerations:

- **70% (34/49) of the RVM Basic Education schools are PAASCU Accredited; 30% (15/49) working towards PAASCU Accreditation**
- **7 schools are ISO Certified**
- **Schools that are not PAASCU Accredited undergo ESC Certification**
- **RVM Quality Road Map was launched in 2012**
- **PCSS was launched in 2016 by CEAP**

PAASCU Accreditation

- fosters **quality education** through voluntary accreditation
It is a leading advocate for quality assurance in ASEAN
- promotes member institutions' implementation of their **vision, mission, and goals, achievement of minimum standards** and **evidenced excellence** based on learning outcomes, and responsiveness to stakeholders
- encourages member institutions to **continually improve** themselves through a culture of on-going and cyclical evaluation, self-assessment and peer review for **quality improvement**

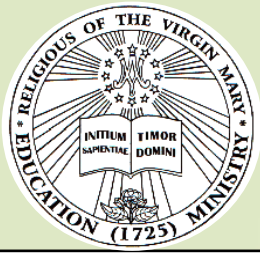
- The ESC Certification program is aimed at assessing and evaluating the extent of compliance to minimum standards of quality of ESC participating institution, encouraging **quality improvement** efforts among ESC participating private schools, and that the ESC schools are not only meeting minimum DepEd standards but are manifesting commitment to raising their standards above the minimum requirement in delivering **quality educational programs and services**.
- The main purpose of certification is to determine whether ESC participating private high schools comply with DepEd minimum standards and with the criteria established in RA 8545 or the “Expanded Government Assistance to Students and Teachers in Private Education” or GASTPE Law.



ISO CERTIFICATION FOR SCHOOLS

Why ISO for schools?

1. Prove the “quality” in the school and Programs with seal of international approval
2. Management’s response to teachers’ quality efforts – Reaching national skill standard
3. Get the edge over other schools with an International recognition
4. Add structure to the system
5. Establish a driver to continuously improve the quality of the system – a “sustaining initiative”
6. Creating ownership by empowering
7. Demonstrating value from system

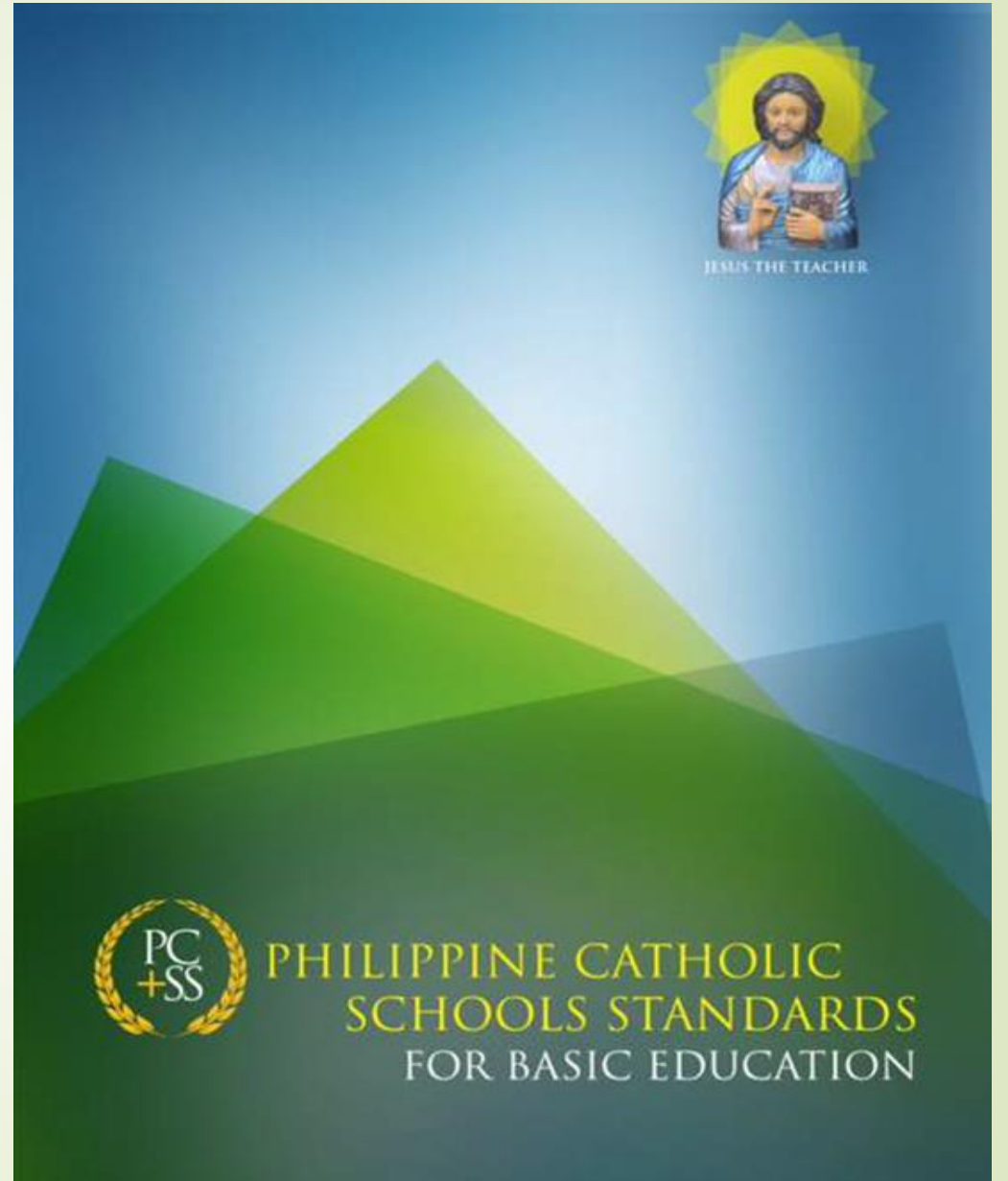

- launched in 2016

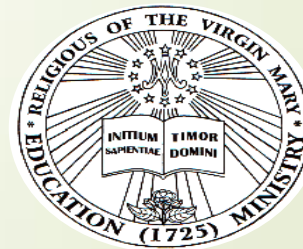


PCSS is a unique document because it is

- b) not an accreditation instrument but a tool for self-improvement;
- c) for collective reflection and discernment on where the school needs to be as it lives out its identity and mission.
- d) a common pathway to the realization of essential identity and fulfillment of mission in the church

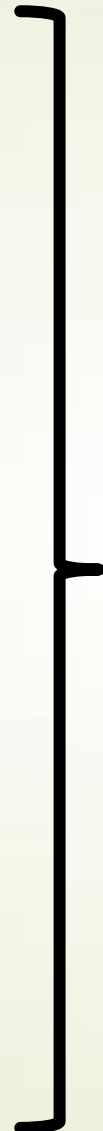

RVM Schools Implementation of the PCSS

- Nov. 2017 - Launching of the PCSS in the congregational level during the RVM EAP National Assembly**
- June 10-11, 2018 - Planning for the Implementation of the Philippine Catholic School Standards (PCSS) for Basic Education in the RVM Schools**
- Launching of the PCSS in the jurisdictional/school level**
- Year 1 - Monthly reflection on the eight (8) defining characteristics**
- Year 2 to 3 - Assessment**
- Updating of the schools' strategic plan/school improvement plan to include areas needing improvement based on the PCSS assessment**

- A) schools due for FAPE recertification/PAASCU visit/ISO certification/recertification in SY 2018-2019/SY2019-2020 – do the inventory of exhibits/documents
- B) schools due for PAASCU visit 2 to 3 years from SY 2018-2019 – start PCSS implementation SY 2018-2019
- C) schools that are not PAASCU accredited and have not implemented RVM QRM – start PCSS/RVM QRM implementation SY 2018-2019

Implementation of the PCSS for basic education by the RVM schools

3. Orientation

3.1 Gather the school heads for a 2-day seminar-workshop on PCSS

3.2 Seminar-Workshop:

- ✓ Re-orient school heads on PCSS using the prepared ppt. presentation
- ✓ Discuss the 2-Year Activity Plan on the implementation of the PCSS
- ✓ Provide them with documents/ materials needed/list of sources of evidence/Defining Evidence
- ✓ Provide opportunity for hands-on experience of evaluating their own school; allow to give their insights and reflections
- ✓ End the seminar with a Para liturgy – Oath of Commitment
- ✓ Assure the school heads that the Jurisdictional team will be willing to assist and that small schools may work on 1 domain at a time following this sequence: CIM, LD, LE, LG, OV

School level:

PHASE 1

ORGANIZATION and SELF-AWARENESS

- Introduce PCSS in a general way – its vision for excellence and Catholic identity of Catholic schools emphasizing the connection of the PCSS with other QA system/s in place in the school
- **Reflect on the eight (8) Defining Characteristics**
- Create the core group and self-study team by domain and designate team leaders; for big/medium sized schools – 1 chairperson/domain; for small schools – the core group composed of all teachers will work on 1 domain /month
- Study the tools for self-assessment for deep and shared understanding of the PCSS
- Identify team responsibilities, expectations, tasks, products and time table

School level:

PHASE 2

Self-Assessment

- Train the school's core group on the utilization of the RVM defining evidence and writing of reports
- Direct the teams to use the RVM defining evidence to self-assess school performance under the assigned benchmarks
- Identify what the benchmark is looking for
- Core group meets with the team leaders to review evidence and summaries from each team
- Team leaders create a narrative by standard and by domain
- Core group and team leaders synthesize the narratives from the different standards and domains
- Core group and team leaders identify the school's important strengths and needed improvements based on the synthesis

Note: For small schools the core group may also be the team leaders. In some cases, they can also be part of the other teams as members

School level:

PHASE 3

RVM School Improvement Plan

- Includes strategic and systematic approach to continuous school improvement
- Based on the results of the assessment, the school updates the school improvement plan/strategic plan to include the needed improvements based on the synthesis
- School head and core group review the results of analysis and interpretation of PCSS self-assessment
- School head and core group determine the SIP priority areas for action
- School head presents the updated SIP to the stakeholders

School level:

PHASE 4

Implementation, monitoring and evaluation of the PCSS-Based SIP

- The school head and team implement the SIP
- The school head and team monitor the implementation of the SIP
 - quarterly/semestral monitoring and reporting of the program action report based from the APAP
 - deviations from the plan are noted and explained (constraints met/internal and external issues
 - facilitating and hindering factors are captured in a regular progress monitoring report
- The school head and team evaluate the implementation of the SIP
 - use the PCSS benchmarks and rubrics for the evaluation and adapt PDCA cycle
- The jurisdictional EMC member shall monitor the status of the PCSS implementation in each school.
